Research Proposal & Annotated Bibliography Assignment

Part 1: Research Proposal

This assignment is designed to help you develop ideas for your final paper—a synthesis of multiple perspectives on a question at issue. Write a thorough paragraph in which you (1) discuss the question you will be examining in your synthesis, (2) summarize the source claim from which your question derives, (3) explain why your question is important to you and to a wider audience, and (4) discuss some possible answers or perspectives you will explore in your final paper.

Part 2: Annotated Bibliography

An annotated bibliography is basically a works cited page that includes summaries of and comments on the sources listed. For this assignment, list six sources that you will use in your synthesis paper. Format each entry according to MLA guidelines (Chapter 16 in *The Writer's World*). Your brief summary should include the central topic and, if relevant, the scope of the source. However, because you are compiling this bibliography to help you get started on your next writing assignment, you must also mention the significance of the source for your paper. Your annotations should be about two or three complete sentences.
